

Gardner Denver Thomas Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Gardner Denver Thomas is committed to sourcing components and materials from companies that share our values regarding respect for human rights, integrity and environmental responsibility.

Gardner Denver Thomas is committed to complying with the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas, as well as the applicable requirements of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, which aims to prevent the use of minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or in adjoining countries ("conflict minerals").

Affected suppliers to Gardner Denver Thomas will be required to commit to being or becoming "conflict-free" (which means that such supplier does not source conflict minerals) and sourcing, where possible, only from conflict-free smelters. Each affected supplier to Gardner Denver Thomas will be required to provide a completed Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) evidencing such supplier's commitment to becoming conflict-free and documenting countries of origin for the tin, tantalum, tungsten, and gold that it purchases.
